What is Community Services Block Grant or CSBG?

Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is federal funding given to local Community Action Agencies to help families and communities combat the causes and conditions of poverty. In NC, CSBG funding supports programs and services that help families move out of poverty. CPCA provides CSBG funded services in Chatham, Orange, Randolph, and Durham counties through our **Participants Achieving Self Sufficiency (PASS) Program**.

How does PASS help families?

We work diligently to address a variety of economic barriers, together with our state and local partners, that prevent families from moving forward and reaching their employment goals. Our objective is to help families increase their income by supporting education/training, helping families gain sustainable employment while learning to manage their finances and promoting ongoing economic mobility.

The CSBG PASS Program offers...

- Case Management
- Financial Assistance
- Education/Training
- Career Guidance/Counseling
- Budgeting/Money Management
- Referrals

PASS is not a bill pay service. To receive financial assistance, PASS participants must be following the program agreement and actively working on goals. Financial assistance must be planned with Case Managers, approved by the agency, and is never guaranteed.

Do You Qualify?

If your household income level is at or below **125% of the federal poverty income guidelines**, and if you are ready to work in partnership with Case Managers long term, then you may qualify for PASS.

2023-24 Poverty Income Guidelines

Family Size	125%
1	\$18,225
2	\$24,650
3	\$31,075
4	\$37,500
5	\$43,925
6	\$50,350
7	\$56,775
8	\$63,200

For families/households with more than 8 people, add \$6,425 for each additional member.
